Introduction

It was a Saturday night and I had been a Christian for exactly one week. The plans were to spend an evening with my new Christian friend's fellowshiping but inside I felt the desperate urge to stay home and pray. I didn't fully understand what was going on inside of me. So I went to my new friend's house and told him what was going on that I thought I needed to go home and pray. This was very odd for me; I didn't know how to pray. I went home with this deep stirring inside me.

As quickly as I could I went in my bedroom and my plans were to read the Bible some and write out my prayers on a piece of paper. The only thing I knew about prayer was from what someone told me earlier that week, “*when you pray be specific.*” I decided to pray specifically for my ex-girlfriend, Joy and my soon to be sister in-law, Barbara. I prayed for others as well but there was just something in me, a heavy burden, to pray specifically for Joy and Barbara. I remember saying to God, “*I don't know how to pray but someone told me to pray specifically so I pray for Joy and my soon to be sister in law, Barbra that they would*

become Christians tomorrow.” I read the Bible some, prayed some more and fell asleep. Woke up the next morning went to church. As soon as I returned home my phone rang and it was Joy. She said, *“You will never guess what happened today. I went to a church today with Barbra and we both gave our lives to Christ!”* Wow! I was totally blown away that God answered my prayers, and so fast. So while it was hot I asked God for a brand new Corvette, \$100,000 and...just kidding on asking God for the Corvette!

That day I learned something very powerful about God and prayer; it’s real, it works and God loves to answer prayers. He hears us when we pray. He’s listening and loves to listen to His kids! Since then I have received many answers to prayers and many prayers that seemingly went unanswered or I just plain got a, *“no,”* and that’s okay, He’s God. He knows what is best for me and He wants what is best for me and for you. I’ve learned that delay in answers is not necessarily denial. God’s timing is perfect. Sometimes God does answer immediately. My mom told me a story when I was a teen and I left home to live with someone else, actually I had to live in my car. The next morning about 9:00 she called her church and they

immediately put me on their prayer chain. I was home by 11:00. God answered their prayer very quick!

Prayer is that subject that many Christians talk a lot about but unfortunately do little of. I am just as guilty as everyone else. I have recently read that the average Christian prays just 5 minutes per day. I also read that the average Pastor prays less than 20 minutes per day. For Christians, prayer is and should be foundational. Prayer is vital if we are going to have a vibrant, dynamic relationship with Christ and if we are going to make a difference in our world. It’s amazing that we have such a power available to us and many rarely tap into the power of prayer. I believe that it is time for the church to get back to the basics. The early church in the book of Acts was so powerful not because of their knowledge but because of whom they knew. The early church met constantly for prayer. Prayer is the most powerful force on earth because as someone said:

“Prayer can do what God can do!”

- Prayer can melt a hard heart.
- Prayer can warm up a cold heart.
- Prayer can activate and arouse an apathetic heart.

- Prayer can heal a broken heart.
- Prayer can change a stubborn heart.
- Prayer can change circumstances.

- Prayer can affect elections.
- Prayer can transform communities.
- Prayer can change the destiny of a nation.

That’s why the great men and women of the Bible and in church history devoted themselves to prayer.

In his book, *“Fresh Wind, Fresh Fire,”* Pastor Jim Cymbala tells the story of a man who came to his mid-week service, he recognized him as a minister. So he invited him to share a few words during their service. The
